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## OVERVIEW

Cub Games is a San Gabriel Valley District event promoting Cub Scout skills and fun. This year's theme, "One Big Happy Family" commemorates the merger of the Lucky Baldwin and Valle Del Sol Districts. It is an opportunity for Scouts to meet their fellow Scouts from across the Valley, learn and practice a few skills, and have fun. This event is open to registered Scouts and adults only; no tag-alongs or siblings allowed.

The Packs will camp at Firestone Scout Reservation Friday and Saturday night. Friday night will be devoted to setting up camp, with a Dutch oven social, leader meeting, and rest. Saturday will be a busy day with an early start full of fun immersive activities geared to foster team work and promote scouting skills. Cub Scouts will have the opportunity to interact with local troops and in the afternoon Webelos can meet for more personal interaction with the District's Scouting BSA Troops in the afternoon. Younger Scouts will engage in games and activities as well as prepare for the evening's entertainment. Saturday night will feature an all hands campfire with songs, skits, awards and lots of fun.

Sunday we will have a Scout's Own, Packs will break down camp, check out, and head home.

## **REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

**\*Siblings are welcomed, but there will be no official program**

### **What is included in registration fee?**

- Camping Fee
- Commemorative Patch

Attendees registering during the late registration may not receive a patch or t-shirt.  
Registration closes on March 15. No walk-ins are allowed.

### **Registration Process:**

All registration will be online at Doubleknot, <http://boyscoutsla.doubleknot.com/event/2019-sgvd-cub-games/2470157> . Doubleknot registration opens on January 22, 2018 and closes on March 15, 2019. Your unit must register through Doubleknot to attend.

Doubleknot will simply ask for the total number of attending adults and attending Scouts at the time of registration. Each unit will need to complete a roster of attending adults and Scouts at Pre-Check-in, discussed below. See Appendix C

All attending adults must have received the current (2018) YPT2 training. Each Pack must provide at least one BALOO trained leader.

Scouts attending as individual or self-directed Scouts must also need to use Doubleknot to register and must be accompanied by a registered adult with current YPT2 training.

Please note all registrations are for the entire event. There is no registration for just the Saturday activities.

## Pre-Check In

All participating Packs will need to attend one of the Pre-Check-In events in order to assure our check-in runs smoothly. Packs are requested to check in all participants attending. Scouts attending individually or as self-directed must also attend a pre-check in event.

### **Pre-Check In procedure:**

#### Who needs to attend:

- Cubmaster, Assistant Cubmaster or attending adult OR
- Cub Committee Member with required paperwork.

#### What you need to bring:

Paperwork:

1. Two copies of the Den Roster form. All cubs attending will be listed alphabetically by last name. (Appendix C). This form will be emailed to Cubmasters once they register if you would like to prepare it digitally. Attending leaders and adults are considered a Den and need to complete a roster for adults. Adults who have been BALOO trained should be identified by adding the word "BALOO" next to their names. Each attending Pack must have at least one BALOO trained adult.
2. Registration should have been done at the Pack level to account for all Dens attending.
3. Two signed copies of the BSA medical records form (680-001, 2014 printing) for each Scout attending the event, in alphabetical order by last name. **Note, the medical forms require either copies of medical insurance cards or medical insurance company and policy number information on the first page in order to be considered complete.** One copy will be turned in and the second copy will be kept by the Cubmaster and carried by the Cubmaster at the event.
4. Two copies of the activity consent form used by your unit. It may be either your unit form or the Scout national form.

#### What to Expect:

There will be several stations at the check-in. At each station, you will turn in paperwork described above and complete other requirements for registration. You will be issued wrist bands for each paying Scout or leader. These go with you and are to be worn at the event. The entire process will take 20-30 minutes max, depending upon your level of preparation.

## Patches and T-Shirts

Participation patches will be provided for all registered and paid attendees. T-shirts will be provided to Scouts who pay the additional t-shirt fee (optional). T-shirts and Patches will be issued to Packs on Friday night at a designated pick up station.

## **ARRIVAL AT CUB GAMES**

Packs may begin arriving at 5:00 pm on Friday March 22. We are at the Loma Linda campground, at the far end of the reservation. See Map in Appendix A. From the guard gate, please allow 10-15 minutes travel time to the campground. The Firestone main gate closes at 9:00 pm, and no further entry is allowed. The gate reopens in the morning at 7:00 am.

Follow the road to the camp check-in, which will be clearly marked. At check-in, you will be directed to your campsite. Please unload your Scout and Scout accessories, and park your vehicle in the designated parking area. No overnight parking is allowed in the camping area. Please note during registration if you expect to haul a trailer and its size.

Loma Linda consists of a large flat area divided by a wash that is crossed by a bridge. We will be camping on the north side of the wash and the activities will be on the south side of the wash. Directly north of the camping area is a small flat topped hill which will be used for parking all vehicles.

Packs will camp together in designated sites. Gear will be dropped off and cars parked separately. Any Pack trailer may be parked at the camp site but must be unhitched from the towing vehicle.

At least two trained adults must camp with each den and should be present during all times when Scouts are in the campsite (morning, lunch and evening). During Saturday morning and afternoon competition times, no Scouts should be in the camping area, unless they are approved to retrieve items or other needs by their Cubmaster or Camp Staff. Scouts must always travel in the buddy system.

## **DEPARTURE FROM CUB GAMES**

Early checkout for units needing to leave on Saturday will take place after the campfire. Contact registration for further instructions.

All Units should leave before 11:00 am, Sunday, March 24, 2019. Please make sure that you have transportation available before that time. As usual, we expect your unit to leave your campsite cleaner than you found it. The Cubmaster must request to have campsite inspection before the Pack is excused to leave.

## PREPARATION FOR CUB GAMES

The primary reasons for holding Cub Games are to test scouting skills, develop team work, increase the level of Scouting Spirit within the San Gabriel Valley District, and to meet new scouting friends. Nobody is competing for scholarships, World Series trophies or grand prizes, so keep that in mind. The following information should be used by Cubmasters and adult leaders to prepare the Packs/Dens for Cub Games:

- All Scouts are expected to have appropriate uniform and insignia. Uniforms will be inspected for consistency, not perfection (see Appendix B). Activity shirts should be worn underneath uniform for quick changing depending on event.
- Scouts should be prepared with their six/ten essentials, a den flag, a den yell/cheer and be prepared to perform a song and skit.
- Dens will be judged exclusively on Saturday's morning events. Dens that do not meet the four-member minimum will be combined to ensure consistency. Teamwork will be essential for all.
- Campsites should have Pack identifiable information clearly displayed and be prepared for pass safety inspection. Packs will be judged separately on overall preparation (Pre-Registration), Participation (Dutch Oven Social, Campfire) and Volunteerism. Camp sites will also be judged for the Event Theme – "One Happy family" – think from the Simpsons, to the Flintstones and all families in between. Be creative and have fun!
- All attendees are expected to live up to the Scout Oath, Law, and Motto during the entire event.
- Review the event Code of Conduct.
- Come prepared to volunteer. This is a large event and will require assistance and participation from all leaders and attending adults.

**Description of Rotations:**

SGVD Troops will be hosting 6 different stations that will include an activity to test each Cub Scout according to their rank on various Cub Scout fundamentals. Each station will also host a variety of Games designed to engage Scouts in physical, analytical and team building skills. Dens will receive an overall score based on their activity and game scores. Dens will be designated a station schedule which will ensure they complete all six stations. There is a mandatory water and snack break at 10:30am, so please make sure your Scouts have water and snacks with them when they start the rotations.

The Fundamental activities will consist of rank specific scoring. A Webelos is expected to recite the Scout Oath, whereas a Tiger is expected to know the Scout Motto. Each den will complete 6 activities.

The Game activity will be an active physical event which should be lots of fun for the involved Scouts. Events may include obstacle course, Concentration, Lava escape, Bigfoot challenge, speed stacking and other games. Dens will not compete directly against each other, but against a clock score or other metric. Dens will be judged on their participation, team work, and scouting spirit as they strive to do their best and live up to the Cub Scout motto.

**CODE OF CONDUCT**

I recognize that my personal conduct and that of all participants attending the Cub Games will do much to enhance the image of Scouting. I therefore accept the following Code of Conduct.

- The Scout Oath will be my guide throughout the Event.
- I will set a good example by keeping myself neatly dressed and presentable. The official Field uniform will be worn during Flag events. During the events on Saturday, an "Activity uniform" may be worn.
- I expect to attend all scheduled activities and take part in as many optional activities as I am able.
- In consideration of the other participants at the event, I agree to be in my tent and remain quiet from lights out to Reveille.
- I will be responsible for keeping my tent clean and neat, and will adhere to all event
- I pledge to do my share to prevent littering and defacing of the event site.
- I agree that no gambling of any kind will be permitted.
- I understand that the illegal possession or use of drugs, alcohol, harmful substances, fireworks and firearms is strictly prohibited.
- I understand that I will be personally responsible for any loss, breakage or theft of property, which I cause.
- Campsite etiquette will be strictly enforced. Permission must be granted before entering another Den's campsite and no one is permitted in someone else's campsites when they are not there. Unit leaders will be informed of violations.

## **COMPETITION GUIDELINES**

Competition scoring will begin when each unit attends Pre-Check-In and will continue from Friday through Saturday morning. In addition to how Dens score during Saturday's events, Packs will be scored on logistics (pre-checking), theme spirit, volunteerism and participation.

### **Uniform and 6 Essentials Inspection**

Uniform Inspection will be performed on Saturday morning prior to the Flag Ceremony. Dens will be judged on the completeness and uniformity of their Den's uniforms.

Scouts should wear "FULL OFFICIAL UNIFORM" (Field Uniform) as stated in the Boy Scout handbook. We will be primarily judged from "belt-up". Packs may have their own rules around pants and shorts and these will be accommodated, however, it is mostly important that Dens are uniform. This means that Dens may decide to all wear Scout shorts, or all have Scout socks. Some Dens may wear a hat or all have boots. Whatever the decision, if they meet the FULL OFFICIAL UNIFORM requirements and ALL SCOUTS IN THE DEN ARE WEARING THE SAME ITEMS, a den can receive full points.

After the Saturday morning flag ceremony/opening, Scouts are encouraged to wear the uniform designated in the handbook for "OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES" (Activity Uniform). Each member of the Den must carry his 6 essentials at all times.

### **Campsite Inspection**

Packs will be judged on their campsite organization, cleanliness, adherence to BSA campsite guidelines, and theme participation. 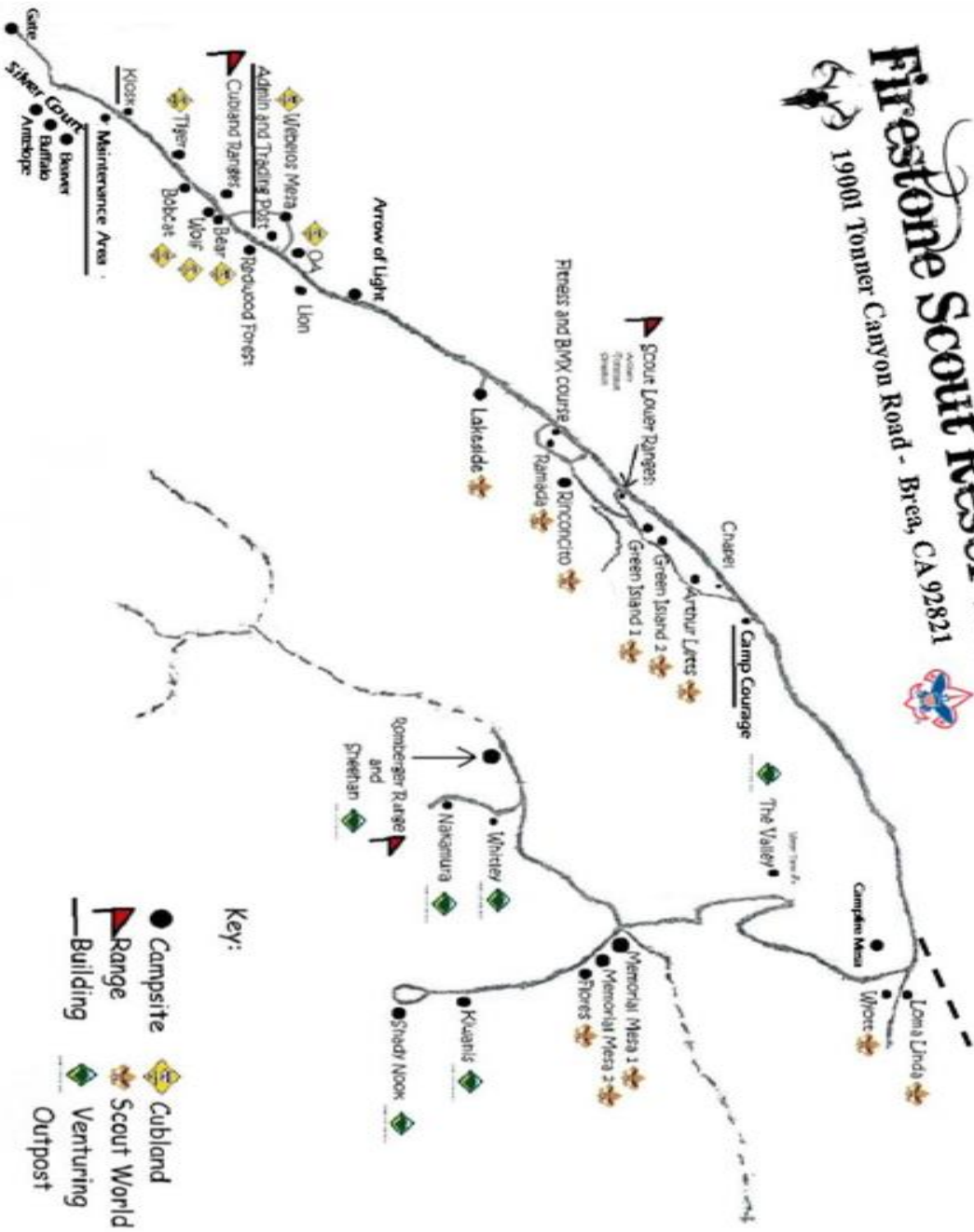
#### ADULT PARTICIPANT CHEAT SHEET

**(Cubmasters: Please distribute to all attending Adults)**

- Who:** All Cub Scouts (Lion to Webelos II) in the San Gabriel Valley District and their parents (sorry, no siblings)
- What:** An opportunity for all Cub Scout Packs to get together to have fun, meet new friends and learn new skills, camp out, and just be boys and girls together.
- Where:** Firestone Scout Reservation, 16001 Tonner Canyon Road, Brea
- Directions:** From the 210/10/60 freeways, go south on the 57 Freeway, exit Brea Canyon Road and turn left. Follow Brea Canyon Road to Tonner Canyon Road, turn left, follow road to guard gate.
- When:** Friday, March 22 to Sunday March 24, 2019.
- How Much:** \$26-35 per Scout; \$15-25 per leader, depending on registration date
- Details:** We will be in the Loma Linda Campground at Firestone. This is literally the end of the road. Follow the signs to the campsite at the far end of Firestone Reservation. Allow at least 15 minutes travel time from the front gate to the campsite. See attached map.
- Gate Details:** Firestone is gate guarded and the security station is staffed from 7:00 am to 9:00 pm; please plan to arrive during those hours. After 9:00 pm and before 7:00 am, it is possible to leave, but no re-entry is allowed.
- Cell Service:** Spotty at best – don't plan on a good signal
- Amenities:** No electrical hookups. No running water. Toilets will be segregated port-a-potties.
- Parking:** No charge for parking; all vehicles will be parked in a lot above the campsites. No overnight parking allowed in campsites.
- ADA Compliant:** Port-a-potties yes, Parking very limited.
- Check-In/Check-Out:** 5:00 pm Friday to noon Sunday. Use Checkpoint at front of Campground.

<b>Class A Uniforms:</b> BSA Issued Shirt. Trousers or Shorts based on Pack Rules

<b>Neckerchief or Hat:</b> If den has these elements – all members participating. If a den does not have these elements – award full points for being “uniform”
