What is Cub Games and Why should we go?

Cub Games is a weekend camping experience for Cub Scouts ranks Tiger through Webelos. This is a chance for the Scouts in your pack to participate at the district level with other Cub Scouts in Games with Meaning. It is a review of the adventures they have had this past year and a taste of what adventures they will encounter next year. The program is based on the current Cub Scout curriculum.

Where will it be held?

This year, Cub Games 2018 will be held at Camp Trask Scout Reservation 1100 N Canyon Blvd., Monrovia, CA 91016.

By coming to the Pre-check-in with ***all your paperwork in order***, your den / pack will receive a **Fast Pass** for a separate check-in area and avoid the long lines.

What to Bring to Orientation to receive a Fast Pass

Registration Receipt with roster of Scouts, adults and siblings attending

Current BSA Medical form Parts A & B, for each attendee.

Who can attend?

Cub Games is open to all currently registered Scouts in your pack, Tiger through Webelos. Siblings of Cub Scout age (first grade to fourth) may attend and participate with dens of their appropriate age.

Leadership Requirements

In all cases a minimum of 2-deep leadership per den is required.

- For Webelos there is a ratio of 1 leader per 5 Scouts, Webelos parents can be included in this ratio. However there must be at least one registered leader with Webelos Outdoor Leader Skills
- For Tiger - Bear there is a ratio of 1 parent per Scout, this is to be maintained at all times. Cub Games should be considered Family Camping under BSA policies.

When should we arrive?

Packs and Dens may start arriving at the check in on Friday March 23 at 5:00 pm. Packs and Dens arriving late may also arrive Saturday March 24 from 6:00 - 8:00 am. Please allow time for check-in and camp set up, Flag raising starts promptly at 8:45 am.

What should I bring at Check-in?

Please have the following items

- Registration Receipt
- Roster of Scouts and Adults attending
- Current BSA Medical form, Parts A & B, for each participant
- OR your FAST PASS

Adults and Scouts leaving from or arriving during the event are required to check-in and out at the Registration Desk. For Packs leaving prior to Sunday's departure please provide information prior to arriving for the weekend.

All forms will be collected at check-in. Please have medical forms in a 9 x 12 Manila Envelope clearly marked with your Unit number and Den number. Only include forms of those who are attending.

Administration will be keeping the forms until check-out. Please have all necessary copies beforehand. All forms will be returned at check-out along with patches.

Any forms or patches left will be available for pick up at the April Roundtable.

Lost and Found items will be available for pick up at the April Roundtable

What Happens if it Rains?

Cub Games is a rain or shine event. Please pack accordingly.

What Facilities are provided?

There are limited picnic tables available. Please bring any tables, chairs etc that you may need.

Restroom facilities are available and are properly identified. Please respect the Women's facilities. Please have the scouts respect the wash stations and use only for washing hands after facility usage.

Water is available throughout the camping area.

What about Meals?

All meals will be provided and prepared by the individual Cub Scout units, whether Pack or Den. All meals and equipment are the responsibility of the participating units.

Will there be a Trading Post?

Camp Trask Trading Post will be open during the afternoon on Saturday.

Is Phone service available at Camp Trask Scout Reservation

Cell service is spotty. You should not plan on being able to use your phone. Arrangements have been made for emergency communications.

Is there Poison Oak?

There is poison oak adjacent to some of the trails and off trail areas. For this reason please ensure proper care when hiking, and stay on the trails.

Is there Friday Night Cracker Barrel

There will be a Cracker Barrel on Friday evening. Charcoal and metal cook tables will be provided. Each Den or Pack is asked to participate by having the boys put together a Dutch Oven treat and cooking it on site.

Is there a Camp Fire Program?

Yes. On Saturday starting at 6:15 pm there will be an Award Ceremony and a multimedia presentation of the days events and photo scavenger hunt.

What Time can we Leave on Sunday?

Please see the schedule below. After clean up of your campsite, contact a staff member at headquarters to inspect your site. Fill out the evaluation form. The staff member will stamp your check-out sheet. Bring your check out sheet and evaluation form to headquarters, and collect your medical forms and patches.

How can I help?

Each Pack will be assigned times to cover the First Aid Station. Please assign a volunteer with some first aid training, Fire Person, Police Officer, EMT, Nurse or Doctor, etc. Each Pack will be given the time slot at check in.

Up to 20 additional points are available for every Den. Our District Executive Charles Pickering will award these points to any Den going above and beyond in showing Scout Spirit.

Recognition

All Dens that participate in Cub Games 2018 will be recognized at the Campfire on Saturday evening. There is a maximum of 540 points possible throughout the weekend until Campfire (580 total possible points with early registration). Ribbons will be awarded to the Dens based on the following criteria;

Presidential	Top 25% Scoring Dens
1st Place	Next 25% Dens
2nd Place	Next 25% Dens
3rd Place	Remainder of Dens

CRITERIA

The criteria for the assignment of points will be judged as follows.

Uniform Inspection

All Cub Scouts are in their Field Uniforms

- Den rank appropriate Uniform
- Cub Scout Shirt (Blue or Tan) (Only Webelos wear Tan)
- Correct Insignia
 - Council Patch
 - Pack Number
 - World Crest
 - Rank (*if any has been earned*)
- Hat / Belt / Neckerchief and Slide

Campsite Set-up / Organization and Cleanliness

This is a two part inspection Part one is initial set-up organization and getting vehicles to the parking areas in a timely manner. Part two includes the following;

- Neat organization of the tents
- Neat organization of the Den or Pack kitchen
 - Display of Menu
 - Fire Extinguisher
- Display of Pack Flag or Banner

- Den Duty Roster
- Fireguard Chart
- First Aid Kit

Cracker Barrel

The Dens have completed set-up of their campsite and participate in the camp-wide Cracker Barrel by bringing something to share.

Morning Flag Ceremony

All members of the Den and parents arrive to the Parade Ground prior to the start of the ceremony.

- All Scouts and Adult Leaders are in Field Uniforms
- Straight Lines organized by Den / rank / Pack

Cub Scout 6 Essentials

- First Aid Kit
- Flashlight
- Trail Mix / Extra Food
- Water
- Whistle
- Sun Protection

Den Flag

Den Flag is carried at the front of the Den line as the Den moves from activity to activity.

Sing a Song

Cub Scouts start the song and all participate in singing a campfire appropriate song. Enthusiasm and participation are being judged.

Den Yell / Cheer

All participate with the Den Yell / Cheer. Enthusiasm and participation are being judged.

Perform a Skit

Cub Scouts start the skit and all participate in a campfire appropriate skit. Enthusiasm and participation are being judged.

Scout Oath and Law

Cub Scouts are to recite the Scout Oath and the Scout Law.

Afternoon Gathering and Instructions

All members of the Den and parents arrive to the Parade Ground prior to the start of the ceremony.

- All Scouts and Adult Leaders are in Activity Shirts
- Straight Lines organized by Den / rank / Pack

Outdoor Photo Scavenger Hunt

Judging will be based on completing the scavenger hunt and participation of the all boys in the Den.

Rules and Regulations

Vehicles

- Speed Limit of 5 MPH
- Park only in designated areas
- No vehicles will be allowed in campsite areas or along emergency vehicle access roads
- Drivers must have their car keys in possession at all times and back cars into parking spaces, in case of emergency evacuation
